

PLAYING OUR WAY TO LITERACY

Read Write Talk Sing Play

MONDAY

Pour some rice, sugar, or flour into a shallow pan. Have your child use a finger to trace shapes or letters, or simply draw in the pan.

TUESDAY

Sing a favorite song together, then sing it very slowly and then sing it as fast as you can!

WEDNESDAY

Encourage your child to lead their own storytime, "reading" to an audience of stuffed animals or family members.

THURSDAY

Jump the ABCs! While singing the alphabet song together, have your child jump once for each letter.

FRIDAY

Fill a box with toys or pictures of things found in nursery rhymes. Pick out an item and think of a rhyme with that in the lyrics. (Ex: Star – sing Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star).

SATURDAY

Take a picture walk!
Look through a
picture book with your
child and talk about
the pictures – try to
relate them to your
child's experiences.

SUNDAY

Hum a tune to a well known song and see if your child can guess the song. Together, sing the song with words. Challenge them to hum a tune and see if you can guess it.

LITERACY TIP:

Read to your child everyday. Reading to your child is the single most important activity that you can to do help your child get ready to read!
