

PLAYING OUR WAY TO LITERACY Read Write Talk Sing Play

MONDAY

Use cookie cutters for little ones to press into dough. Talk about the shapes and how many sides each one has.

TUESDAY

Instead of tracing letters with fingers or pencils, use small toy cars to drive through the letters. This will add interest for the little ones who love vehicles.

WEDNESDAY

Set out alphabet flash cards. Have your child find toys that start with the card's letter. Example: a card with the letter Y could have a yo-yo matched up to it.

THURSDAY

Trap one of your child's toys inside a cup by covering it with plastic wrap, rubber bands, or tape. Ask them to rescue their toy by tearing it open.

FRIDAY

Make a rainbow sensory bin using buttons, pom-poms, feathers, milk caps, etc. Have your little one use hands or tongs (for more fine motor work) to sort the items.

SATURDAY

Do you know any songs about the weather? Sing them together and then talk about the different kinds of weather and the type you are experiencing each day.

SUNDAY

Roll small one inch sized balls of dough.
Roll a die and pick the same number of dough balls to smash with a toy hammer, fork, spoon, or hands.

LITERACY TIP:

Counting everyday things like the number of stairs you climb or trees you see helps teach one-to-one correspondence. This will help kids learn early math basics.
